The Start of the Token 3 Club

The Token Club started in July 1946. Alcoholics Anonymous grew exponentially in the early 1940s after visits from Bill Wilson in 1941, 1943 and a public speaking appearance in 1944. To handle the growing fellowship, the Club was formed and rented rooms at the Vaughn Building, 300 W. Main, at the corner of Third and Main Streets. Its initial purpose was to provide opportunities for the social activities of the A.A. members. A year later, 1947, a secretary was employed to handle the growing business functions of the fellowship - the start of Central Office if you will. Today A.A. traditions ensure clubs and A.A. are separate entities. In the late 1940s, however, the Token Club and the Central Office worked closely to serve the A.A. fellowship. By December 1948 Central Office had moved to the Realty Building at Sixth and Jefferson but it continued to share telephone numbers with the Token Club. In fact, the Token Club and Central Office shared a telephone number through August 1960. More history to come!
